Dear Intended World Language Education Student:

World Language Education is one of the College of Education's high demand majors. A high demand major is one which receives or expects to receive more applications from fully qualified students than the program can accommodate without endangering the quality of instruction offered. This is to inform you of the admission process for World Language Education. The decision to admit is made by the faculty based on the quality of the application requirements, as specified in the program materials.

This program accepts 15 students each year. This is a Fall Start Only program. <u>Applications are due on the third Friday in January of the junior year or when students are ready to begin the professional sequence the following fall.</u>

Application eligibility:

- Minimum 2.6 overall GPA
- Completion of Core Area VI with a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Minimum 50 hours of pre-professional experience
- Passing or exemption of the GACE Program Admission Assessment
- Minimum score of Intermediate-High on the Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI)

Selection Criteria:

•	Pre-professional experience & Resume	30%
•	Statement of purpose	30%
•	Core Area VI GPA	20%
•	Letters of Recommendation	20%

Courses students must complete in order to enter the program include:

- Core Areas I-VI
- At least 7 of the 9 upper-level language courses

NOTE: Any upper-level language courses not complete by the start of student teaching during spring of the senior year will delay graduation, as no additional coursework may be added to the student teaching seminar.

Students pursuing a dual degree must meet with an advisor from each college every semester.
